

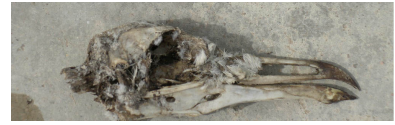
'Duck's dinner'

- A flat, rounded beak works as a [tea strainer](#) / [tweezers](#) / [meat hook](#).
- A hooked, pointend beak as a [tea strainer](#) / [tweezers](#) / [meat hook](#).
