PAINTINGS

HANGING MOBILES

- They hang from the ceiling or from a wall.

RELIEFS

- They are similar to sculptures, but you can not look at them from all points of view because they are stuck to a surface.
- They are in between two and three-dimensional artworks.

SCULPTURES

- They have got volume.
- They are three-dimensional artworks, so you can look at them from any point of view.
- They are meant to decorate.
- They are usually made out of hard materials such as iron, wood, metal, plastic, stone, marble or plaster.
- At school, we can make them using different materials. For example: clay, objects from nature, plasticine, papier maché, recycling objects.
- You can see them in the museums, but you can also find lots of them in the streets.
