ASSESSMENT

From the second term on students will do exam practice, the aim of which is to make them familiar with the type of exam they will be sitting at the end of the year and to check their progress.

The pass mark is 65%.

SKILLS PRACTICE

Listening: Students will have intensive listening practice at least once every week, in the classroom (which is equipped with a TV, a VCR and DVD set).

Reading: Besides the readers (see p.1) students will be required to complete at least one reading comprehension exercise with every unit in the book.

Writing: Teachers will ask students to write a composition for every unit in the coursebook. This piece of writing will be either a letter, an e-mail or a narrative text (normally related to a specific book unit, topic or/and grammar point).

Oral: There will be opportunities for oral practice every day, this will include : pair work, group discussions, role plays, etc.
